Our volunteer used some quick thinking and set up a situation where this elusive mother cat would bring the rest of her kittens in safety, allowing us to ensure that we could catch them all in order to save them.

A total of four gorgeous kittens showed up within a day and a half! We were able to trap the mother cat and when we brought them all to the vet for a check-up, we discovered that she was not only domesticated, but incredibly sweet and loving. There wasn't a dry eye in that examination room, because it meant that we had the opportunity to find all of her babies homes, as well as the sweet mother cat. So we named her Annie and all of them went into foster where we were able to watch them grow from infancy into these wonderful, happy, socialized older kittens.

Annie and her only son went to a wonderful home together, as did two of the other kittens. And the last little one went to a home with two new best friends - a little girl and a very gentle dog. We're thrilled to report that this entire family is blossoming and is happy and healthy in their furever homes!

Helping Hands: Panther


Panther needed medical intervention!

We know how many people care for outdoor community cats and we know just how much they are

loved and that bonds of trust that are formed over time.

We received an emergency plea for help from someone who was feeding a small colony of cats. One of these semi-feral cats named Panther showed up in rough shape one day, limping and in pain, and their caregiver was desperate to get him help, but could not afford vet bills.

Panther allowed himself to be picked up by his caregiver and we were able to arrange transport for a vet visit to figure out what was happening. After x-rays and an exam, the veterinarian could tell that



So we helped his caregiver with the vet bills and medication costs and assisted her with the steps she needed to take to socialize Panther the rest of the way to become an indoor cat since it was too dangerous for him to go outside again with just three functional legs.

We're happy to report that Panther made a full recovery from his infection and is thrilled to be a spoiled indoor cat. He even uses that fourth leg a bit!

We couldn't save cats like Panther without your help!

Second Chances: Grace

Sometimes there's more than meets the eye!

A kind woman found a tiny grey cat curled up in a ball in the middle of a sidewalk. The woman, who we had previously helped with TNR, contacted us immediately as she was extremely concerned for the well-being of this poor cat who was in terrible shape. Once we collected this little one, it was clear she could not cope with living outdoors and had not eaten in a very long time, as she was shockingly and heartbreakingly emaciated.



She was given the appropriate name, Grace, and received a complete medical evaluation, plenty of food and lots of rest. Unfortunately, it was determined that Grace had a significant heart murmur and a severe vision handicap. Although Grace was a sweet cat at heart, her inability to see well made her very nervous and jumpy in situations where she didn't know what to expect with new people and new places that she couldn't see properly. So Grace was faced with many challenges, including finding a home where she could be accepted not only for her medical disabilities, but for her tendency to sometimes be a sassy as a result of those disabilities.

What we discovered though, was that Grace responded brilliantly to audio cues! So for example, she felt much more comfortable when you talked to her as you walked nearby, because she knew where you were without any surprises. And when Grace had trouble judging distance to jump down from somewhere, we could snap near the floor, and she would have an audio and visual cue as to how far down the floor was. It became clear how very smart she was and very adept at compensating for her poor vision. We realized there was more than meets the eye with this cat and

that her future looked bright!

So we reached out to our wonderful network to find the ideal home for a special girl like Grace. An amazing woman saw past Grace's disabilities and fell in love with her instantly and Grace is now in the most wonderful home with the kindest woman who adores her. And the feeling is obviously mutual, as Grace slept with her new mom on her very first night together and follows her around the house - they have a beautiful connection based on kindness and trust. It doesn't get better than that!
